As you may know, Congress may consider legislation to immediately reunite thousands of children with their parents after they were separated at the U.S. border. If passed, the bill will prohibit parents from being deported until their child's immigration proceeding is over, establish an interagency office aimed at locating and reuniting children with their parents, and redirects \$50 million in appropriations from ICE to cover the costs of enforcing the bill.
